Memorial Garden for Cremated Remains

The quiet rural setting of the Church creates a peaceful atmosphere that is appreciated and valued by the wider community. The Church is open during the day and visitors are welcome to use both the Church and grounds for quiet prayer and reflection.

We are now in a position to offer people the choice of being able to bury the ashes of their loved ones in a dedicated plot, with a memorial stone and flower vase, within the church graveyard.

The creation of a memorial garden for the burial of ashes, which allows for the erection of a memorial stone to commemorate the deceased, was created in part thanks to a generous donation from the Rev. George Kirk. This new facility was dedicated in June 2014.

The memorial garden has been designed to be in keeping with the general rural nature of the graveyard. There are therefore restrictions on the size, style and materials that can be used for the memorial stone and we only have permission for memorial stones that meet the following requirements:

Memorial Stone Specifications

The stone must be a simple sloped tablet 17 inches (or nearest metric equivalent) square (CJ331 in Rotherham Memorials catalogue). The stone is to be dark grey granite with a honed finish. A central integral flower vase is permitted. Lettering should be gold in Book Antique Bold font. No other flower holders, decorations or ornaments are permitted.
