



#### ON THE BEST WAYS FOR A VICAR TO DISRUPT CHRISTMAS

The Rectory St James the Least of All

My dear Nephew Darren,



I am sorry I was not alive during that wonderful four-year period when Oliver Cromwell abolished Christmas; no Christmas parties, no carol services, no cards to send and no frantic last-minute shopping. That man was a hero.

Planning for Christmas at St James' normally starts on 2nd January. By Easter, the flowers for church have been carefully chosen to be colour coordinated, and the seating plans and table decorations for the Christmas party have been allocated (with nominated reserves in case someone should inconveniently die in the intervening eight months). Long before Summer is over, the tree lights have been tested, music for the 9 Lessons and Carols Service has been chosen and the service sheets printed. Way before the dark nights set in, car parking attendants will have been found, those who are to light all the candles will have been rehearsed to perfection, and the brass lectern has had its annual polish.

We do not do spontaneity at St James the Least of All. If ever there was a service when time for something unexpected had to be allowed, its place would be announced in the order of service, how long the unexpected thing would happen for would have been decided by a committee, and who was to be spontaneous would have been allocated on a rota.

But the one person none of these well-meaning, efficient, committed organisers can control is the Rector. You could call it a staff perk. Carols will (accidentally, of course) be announced in the wrong order; if verse 3 was to be omitted, I announce it will be verse 4. This keeps the organist on his toes while the choir hovers on the point of a collective nervous breakdown. At the Christmas supper, my introductory welcome speech and extensive grace make those in the kitchen wonder if the vegetables being boiled should better be served as thick soup.

I offer the helpful suggestion that the tree, having been installed and decorated in the chancel, may perhaps look better in the sanctuary and I turn all the heating off throughout the season, explaining that it will help the flowers to last. All Services will start five minutes early (was my watch rather fast?) so I can look disapprovingly at those still coming in while we are singing the first carol and making it clear that I think they had spent too long in the pub next door.

And so we all reach Christmas morning, with 12 months of planning having gone yet again slightly awry, with parishioners exhausted and I exhilarated at the chaos that has been created with such ease. Mr Cromwell, your spirit lives on.








#### THE AUGHTON MEMORIAL CLOCK





A general meeting of the Aughton Memorial Clock Fund Committee was held in the Robin Hood Inn, Aughton. Mr W E.Roys presided and Mr A Jones outlined the reason the fund was begun. He said it was right that the parish (and particularly the people of Aughton) should know what had been done and how the funds had been spent.

The committee was formed in October 1954, because he and several others thought that the Aughton Memorial Clock, which was put up after the First World War, should be put in order. He asked the Robin Hood Beetle Club members for financial assistance and from among the members of the club, the Memorial Fund Committee was formed. Mrs. D. Driver of the Beetle Club had officiated as secretary and Mr W E Roys as chairman and treasurer. The people of Aughton had supported various efforts and donations had been received, but the Robin Hood Beetle Club had raised most of the funds.

The Beetle Club used to meet upstairs in the brick building behind the Robin Hood which is currently furnished as hotel rooms. I used to go there with my mother to play Beetle!.

After spending £10 in an attempt to have the original clock repaired, it was found after trial and investigation that the clock would not function and it was decided to get an electric clock. Approval for the fixing of the clock was obtained from the West Riding County Council and the Education Committee and the clock was fixed as before on Aughton School.

The approximate cost of the clock and expenses incurred in installing it amounted to £44. Funds totalling £39.3s.3d. had been raised but there remained approximately £3.10s.to be raised to clear all expenses. The clock had a guarantee of twelve months. It was decided that the committee should continue and should endeavour to raise the necessary amount.

Mr Roys and Mrs. Driver were appointed as Trustees of the Clock which is vested in the Memorial Clock Committee. The committee originally set out with two objects, one – to put the clock in order (which has been achieved) and the other to have a new memorial plaque to commemorate the fallen in both wars. The committee thanked the people of Aughton who have supported the project, and also any others who have helped.

#### Village Clock Restored

Some years later, further work needed to be carried out and on the 9<sup>th</sup> November 1999 it was reported in the local paper that the Aughton clock was back in its time-honoured place on the front of the village school, thanks to the efforts of local residents. The restored clock was unveiled, for a second time, by the Mayor of Rotherham, Councillor Iain St. John.

"The landmark timepiece was placed on the front of Aughton School to commemorate villagers who died during World War I. The clock became part of village life and was greatly missed when it was taken down, but after a year of fund raising by the people of Aston, Aughton and Swallownest, the clock is back in position on the school. Next Thursday, the deputy mayor will unveil a special plaque to mark the occasion. All those who contributed towards the replacement of the clock have been invited to the ceremony and members of the Royal British Legion will also be taking part."



About 700AD the people of Aston embraced Christianity and built a church: probably of wattle and wood. After the Norman Conquest in 1066 the Norman Lord erected a Hall and rebuilt the Church in Stone.









#### BANNING CHRISTMAS PURITAN STYLE

Ladybird's 'An Adventure from History' series were my first history books. They were cheap, beautifully illustrated, easy to read little hardbacks. My school history teacher thought them 'popular and unreliable.' Ladybird's



'Oliver Cromwell' pictures the valiant MP cum cavalry officer, leading of the Parliamentary forces in the English Civil War, (1642-51). He sits astride a white charger with his hand on his thigh, full of confidence. A heroic figure *excepting* that he banned Christmas. (Only *he* didn't.)

After the execution of King Charles I Cromwell became 'Lord Protector of the Commonwealth of England, Scotland and Ireland' in 1653. As a Puritan he believed Christmas was wasteful and a 'great dishonour of God'. Festival days should be days of religious contemplation, not 'making merry'. In 1644 the feast of Christmas was abolished, along with Whitsun and Easter, as part of the political agenda of the 'Godly' or Parliamentary party. Puritans saw 'Christ's Mass' as an unwelcome reminder to them of England's former Catholicism. Festivals were sinful. Cromwell was not *personally* behind abolition but tacitly approved.

Christmas in the 1600s ran for the full twelve days. It included religious services but also, feasting, games, decorations, singing, gambling, performances and the giving of gifts including 'boxes' of money for servants and the poor. Tap houses and taverns were packed out. 'Misrule' was common. Parliament made its point by sitting on Christmas Day. It insisted that shops, markets and businesses *stay open*, although Parliament complained on Christmas Day 1656 that there was 'not a shop open, nor a creature stirring'.

The English are law abiding people unless they decide they feel the law is unfair or unjust. Laws affecting Christmas and social gatherings have always been impossible to police without consent. Despite the law and the official obligation to simply fast and pray most people had other ideas. There were also pro-Christmas riots in many towns, especially as Cromwell's regime grew increasingly unpopular using ever more force. As one illegal pamphleteer stated '... Festivals and ...holy days... are the main things which the more ignorant and common sort among them do *fight* for.'

Secret Christmas services were often held and 'the rules' subverted. Famously the diarist John Evelyn was arrested by a troop of soldiers which surrounded the terrified congregation of a Church Christmas service in 1657. Nevertheless, an Essex Puritan noted people were still 'holding fast to their heathenish customs and abominable idolatries, and think they do well'. But another preacher was prosecuted for preaching against Christmas and then going straight home to eat mince pies!

Cromwell died in 1660. His body was exhumed shortly after Christmas in January 1661. He was given a posthumous execution with mutilation. His body was hanged in chains and his head was stuck on a pole at Westminster Hall for 24 years. Christmas was quickly revived along with the restored monarchy. At Christmas I am happy to still belong to the 'more ignorant and common sort'.

## JOURNEYS OR LOCKDOWN THIS CHRISTMAS?

Christmas is a busy time for travel, as many of us venture a great distance to see family or friends again. But this year coronavirus has put an end to all that. Seeing all our loved ones this Christmas will be difficult, if not impossible. Soon we may not be travelling anywhere very much at all.

Have you noticed that the Christmas story is about journeys? It begins with Mary and Joseph travelling from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Then, some shepherds receive news from an angel about a special birth. They travel through the night, across dark fields and down unlit streets to search for the baby Jesus.

After this, in an eastern country some wise men see a new star, one that heralds a new king. They leave home and set out with only the star to guide them, and their faith to reassure them that Someone special is waiting at the end of their journey.

All these travellers must have wondered what really lay ahead. Nothing was fully understood, carefully planned for, or safe. They all travelled with questions and uncertainties. But God had come unexpectedly into their lives, and suddenly they were given new roles to serve Him. Despite worldly circumstances that could have crushed them, they stood firm and trusted God all the way.

These travellers' tales tell us that God may suddenly enter into our familiar, or this year, unfamiliar circumstances. He may come in surprising ways, to prompt us into new avenues of service. At first His call on us may be uncomfortable and challenging.

If our response is anything like Joseph, Mary, the shepherds and wise men - to be obedient to His call in serving, witnessing and worshipping, we shall be greatly blessed and rewarded.

We are all on life's journey.

If we travel with God,

He will be faithful and lead us to

His heavenly Home.



Christingle services are held in churches, usually between Advent and Candlemas. It is an excellent opportunity for people of all ages use oranges to create visible symbols of the Christian message.

The idea of Christingle came from a Moravian Church in

Germany in 1747. The Minister, John de Watteville, gave children at the service a lighted candle with a red ribbon around it.

This represented Jesus being the light of the world and the final prayer of that first service was "Lord Jesus, kindle a flame in these children's hearts, that theirs like Thine become". The custom went around the world with the church. Missionaries brought the Moravian Church to England in the late 1700s. In Moravian churches, the Christingle Service is usually held on the Sunday before Christmas or on Christmas Eve. Missionaries brought the Moravian Church to England during the

1700s, but the Christingle tradition was not made popular in the UK until 1968.

Much later, this simple candle was replaced by a more elaborate Christingle which is rich in symbolism to remind us that Christ is the light who came into the world at Christmas. Our modern Christingle consists of:

- \* The Christingle orange represents the world, John reminds us that "Jesus was in the world, and though the world was made through Him, the world did not recognise Him. He came to that which was His own, but His own did not receive Him". (John 1 v 10 11).
- \* The red ribbon of the Christingle represents the blood of Jesus which was shed for us so that our sins may be forgiven. "But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son,
- \* purifies us from every sin". (1 John 1 v 7).
- \* The fruits and sweets on the four skewers represent God's gifts to us, the fruits of the earth and the four seasons. "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease". (Genesis 8 v 22).
- \* The lighted candle, pushed into the centre of the orange, represents Christ, the light of the world. "He [Jesus] said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life"; (John 8 v 12)




