Aughton Junior Football Club.

In February 1958 the Rotherham Advertiser reported the demise of Aughton Junior Football Club. "Flagging interest among officials and committee members has brought about the final extinction of Aughton Juniors Football Club who have not played a match since the 1955-56 season. At a meeting at the Black Bull Hotel, Aughton, last Saturday, called by the trustees to discuss the club, it was decided that the affairs of Aughton F.C. should be "wound up". Money in the possession of the club, amounting to £10 17s 10d. goes to the Black Bull Old Age Pensioners' Treat Fund. To Aughton Youth Club goes all the Juniors playing tackle.

"So, a club with a fine playing record no longer exists. Aughton Juniors won every trophy in local football with the exception of the Sheffield Junior Cup,



although they reached the final of that competition on two occasions. Formed in the 1944-45 season, the Juniors first entered the Holbrook League winning the championship twice."

"They had the distinction of being the only junior club ever to win the Wharncliffe Charity Cup. Aughton is the poorer by the "winding up" of Aughton Juniors, despite the fact that a new club, Swallownest Welfare, is making a mark in local football. Their secretary is Mr. L. Kyte who formerly had the same position with the Juniors."

Aughton Wesleyan was another local football team. I have a photo of them during the 1920-21 season. Unfortunately, I don't know when the club started or when it ceased playing. If anyone has any information, please get in touch.

Aughton Welfare Football Club. It was reported in the local paper in July 1950, that two keen Aughton footballers, Ken Naylor and Gordon Lax, had the idea of starting a team for local lads. They went from house to house in a search for players and received the support of 24 village youths. They called a meeting and Aughton Welfare Football Club was formed. The lads used some of their pocket money to fund the buying of football gear. They asked permission of the Aughton Welfare Committee to use the football ground on the Welfare site. This was granted, as well as the use of the pavilion as a changing room, with a condition that the footballers help the Welfare Committee at Aughton Gala. This was agreed and they began playing in Division "C" of the Rotherham Association League. Does anyone know how long this team played and when it was disbanded?

ASCENSION DAY, 40 DAYS WITH THE RISEN CHRIST

40 days after Easter comes Ascension Day. These are the 40 days during which the Risen Christ appeared again and again to His disciples, following His death and resurrection. (Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; and John 20.)



The Gospels give us little of Christ's teachings and deeds during those 40 days. Jesus was seen by numerous of His disciples: on the road to Emmaus, by the Sea of Galilee, in houses, etc. He strengthened and encouraged His disciples, and at last opened their eyes to all that the Scriptures had promised about the Messiah. Jesus also told them that as the Father had sent Him, He was now going to send them – to all corners of the earth, as His witnesses.

Surely the most tender, moving 'farewell' in history took place on Ascension Day. Luke records the story with great poignancy: 'When Jesus had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, He lifted up His hands – and blessed them.'

As Christmas began the story of Jesus' life on earth, so Ascension Day completes it, with His return to His Father in heaven. Jesus' last act on earth was to bless His disciples. He and they had a bond as close as could be: they had just lived through three tumultuous years of public ministry and miracles – persecution and death – and resurrection! Just as we part from our nearest and dearest by still looking at them with love and memories in our eyes, so exactly did Jesus: 'While He was blessing them, He left them and was taken up into heaven.' (Luke 24:50-1) He was not forsaking them, but merely going on ahead to a kingdom which would also be theirs one day: 'I am ascending to my Father and to your Father, to my God and your God...' (John 20:17)

The disciples were surely the most favoured folk in history. Imagine being one of the last few people on earth to be face to face with Jesus, and have Him look on you with love. No wonder then that Luke goes on: 'they worshipped Him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.' (Luke 24:52,53)

No wonder they praised God! They knew they would see Jesus again one day! 'I am going to prepare a place for you... I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.' (John 14:2,3) In the meantime, Jesus had work for them to do: to take the Gospel to every nation on earth.



Technology and Care at Home

Hands up everyone: 'Who thinks support in your own home will be replaced by robots anytime soon?' Not many hands up I see... Everyone wants the human touch. Nevertheless, I was recently asked to explain the changes which have taken place in the ten years since we started Home Instead in Rotherham. It was surprising just how many relate to technology.



Ten years ago everything was done on paper, all records were paper based and it sometimes took ages to implement adjustments to care. Now we log Client activity, medication and other visit related information on a special online system. This also allows Clients and their loved ones (with consent) to see what is happening immediately. This reassures family members and ensures key quality audit processes are kept up to date. More information being available online has proven to be especially important during COVID with families being unable to visit

Electronic medication administration records can be updated immediately – saving any delay or confusion about what medication should be given, when and how. Clients and their families can also see who is scheduled to visit and when - we are a one-to-one service but everyone needs a holiday sometimes. This also helps us arrange extra trips out/family liaison and GP visits at short notice.

A Client with a poor memory will often tell their family that 'No one has been today' when, in fact, they have. The Family Portal reassures both the family and the Client as it states who went and exactly what happened during the visit. Family can remind their loved one that 'Kathy went and made breakfast with you at 9am' or 'Kathy has been. You went for a walk to the shops'. 'Do you remember you had some lemon cake – there is some more left in the pantry...'. Another benefit is that CAREGivers don't have to handle bulky Client folders along with family – thus helping with infection control too.

We have been using tablets more to help continue regular service reviews, spot checks and other ad hoc virtual 'visits' to our clients through lockdown. They have also been used help support virtual survey of properties in preparation for installing our Home Aware sensors in addition, to linking families and clients for video calling. Home Aware sensors (no cameras are involved) help families (with Client consent) to monitor if their loved one is up and about as usual, eating and drinking and so on. If not they will be alerted automatically and we can follow up.

Despite all the new technology however the human touch and relationship building is vital. We are all longing to get back to as much of the personal approach as possible as well especially now vaccination has happened. We will also be re-establishing our Rotherham Friendship Lunches – last seen in March 2020 – We are looking forward to a good social chat, dance and live music with our old friends on a lovely safe local trip out!




