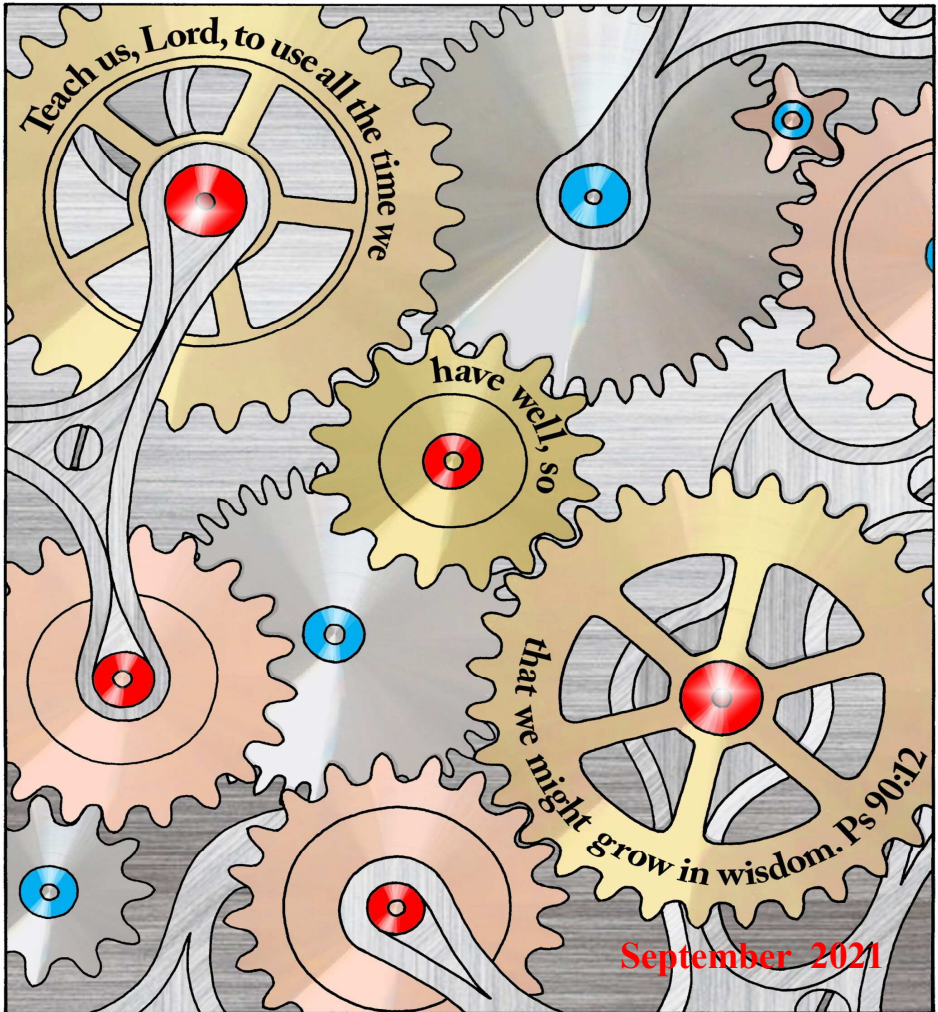

SERVICES DURING SEPTEMBER 2021

Further to the Government's lifting of restrictions on 19 July 2021
the church will be fully open for services.

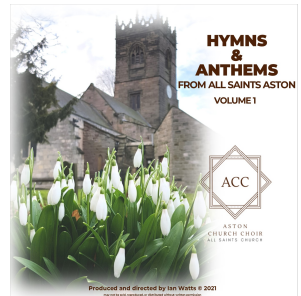

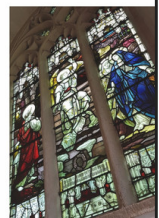

PEACE AT SWALLOWNEST



Swallownest School

This letter was sent to the Sheffield Daily Telegraph on Thursday 24th July 1919, praising the organisation of Peace Celebrations in Swallownest.

“Sir, Among the reports of the Peace celebrations in Sheffield and district in the “Telegraph”, I fail to notice any mention of the really fine effort made by Swallownest, but this is, I suppose due to the modesty of the organisers. As the organisers were, I understand, the whole population of the village, I, as a visitor, would like to bear tribute to the wonderful unanimity and enthusiasm shown by our neighbours which resulted in a fête worthy of a much larger centre.

“Punctually at half-past twelve a procession of gaily-decorated cars with tableaux and children in bright dresses to represent the peoples of the Allied nations, with banners and streamers, headed by the Woodhouse Band and local demobilised soldiers, set out from Swallownest School to march round the village, and then to the field where the day’s fun commenced. There was singing by the children, Morris dancing by the girls, drill by the boys, Maypole dancing by the younger children, and sports for everyone.



“At four o’clock there was an adjournment to the schools, where tea was served. The lavishness of the supplies made one wonder whether the old pre-war days of happy memory had not come back, those happy days when ration books and Food Controllers were unknown. Swallownest feasted herself and her guests unsparingly, and even when everyone had finished, there was enough to begin all over again.

“Then back to the field for the finals of the sports and dancing to the music of the Woodhouse Band, until the unfortunate downpour about eight o’clock. All the same, the huge bonfire and the effigy of the Kaiser were duly burnt, and the day ended gloriously in spite of the weather.

“What struck a visitor most was the perfection of the organisation and the smoothness and absence of confusion about everything, and the highest credit is due to Mr. Birks, the headmaster, and his staff of teachers, and to the public of Swallownest. I nearly forgot to mention that at the close of the proceedings every child went away with a large packet of sweets.

“I feel sure, Mr. Editor, that you will be pleased to make a public record of this red-letter day for our small neighbour, and to ignore that modesty to which I have before alluded. Although it is always desirable to do good by stealth, it will do no harm in this case for Swallownest “to blush to find it known”.

3 September : St Gregory the Great : The man who saved the Angels

Pope Gregory never called himself ‘the Great’, but instead ‘the Servant of the Servants of God’.

Nevertheless, Gregory was one of the most important popes and influential writers of the Middle Ages. The son of a very rich Roman senator, he left the service of the State upon his conversion as a young man. Gregory then sold off his tremendous estates to found six monasteries in Sicily and a seventh in Rome, and gave generously to the poor. He became a monk and adopted an austere lifestyle. But he was destined to be a frustrated monk, because successive popes kept appointing him to jobs with major public responsibilities.



Christians in England owe him a great deal. When Gregory came across some English slaves for sale in Rome, he asked who they were, and was told, ‘They are Angles.’ Moved with compassion for these humiliated and despised men, he replied, ‘They are not Angles, but angels!’ He wanted to lead a band of missionaries to England to evangelise the Angles, but then plague broke out in Italy, and during this time he was elected Pope.

Reluctantly he accepted, and then sent to work to deal with the crises facing Christendom: plague, floods, famine, and a Lombard invasion. But busy though Gregory was, he did not forget the Angles. He sent Augustine to England, and so indirectly became the apostle of the English.

Gregory is also well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as pope. Here are a few of his Quotes:-

“You do not climb a Mountain in leaps and bounds, but by taking it slowly.”

“The proof of love is in the works. Where love exists, it works great things. But when it ceases to act, it ceases to exist.”

“If the work of God could be comprehended by reason, it would no longer be wonderful, and faith would have no merit if reason provided proof.”

24 September : St Gerard Segredo - Church Planting in the Eleventh Century

It's amazing how little some things change down the centuries. Take the life of Gerard Sagredo, for instance. He left his 'comfort zone' of home and church because he felt God's calling on his life. He travelled abroad and taught in order to earn his living in a non-Christian country. In his spare time he shared his faith with the people he met, and gradually some were converted. Soon he had 'planted' a little church.

Gerard's life sounds like that of a western missionary in parts of the developing world today. In fact, he was an 11th century monk from Venice. He was the prior of San Giorgio Maggiore, but gave up the security in order to attempt the pilgrimage to Jerusalem. But God stopped Gerard when he reached Hungary, for King Stephen not only welcomed him, but pressed him to become tutor to his son.

Gerard agreed, and soon he had converted a group of people around him. In those days monks did not just plant churches – they planted entire 'sees' of the church, and so the see of Csanad was established, with Gerard as its first bishop.

But the problems of then and now seem surprisingly similar. Gerard Sagredo worked in the face of growing hostility from local people of other faiths, and half-hearted commitment from some of his own converts. Nearly 1,000 years later, Christian missionaries all over the world are still facing the same two struggles.

Sadly, the next bit of the story is also all too familiar: King Stephen died, and the new people in power hated Christians. In 1038 persecution began. In 1046 Gerard was attacked in the street, and stoned. A lance was thrust through him. His body was then hurled into the Danube. Gerard Sagredo had become a martyr of the Persecuted Church.

The non-Christians killed Gerard that day, but they did not kill Christianity. In the years to come many more thousands of Christians would die, while the church grew, not shrank. Meanwhile, Venice paid homage to her first ever martyr by translating some of his relics back to the island of Murano in 1333.





Steps back to an enjoyable future...

Government communications have advised and cajoled us on 'all matters Covid' for many months. But now all high-risk groups (and more) have been offered vaccination. The impact of Covid in terms of serious illness, hospitalisations and death appears much reduced. But it is now 'endemic'. It will never 'disappear'. So, it is time to learn how to live with it, as we do with other illnesses, including seasonal ones.

I hope the media will eventually end the gloominess about Covid. I am not hopeful it will, especially during the flu season, hence pre-empting that now. A good practical step in reducing fear (and health risks) generally will be to consider taking up the offer of a flu jab this autumn, subject always to medical advice from your GP.

Flu jabs are free for people over 50 and for those with long term health conditions or who work in certain sectors. It is also free for children. See the website: <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/flu-influenza-vaccine/> Getting back to normal may not always be easy.

Like many people I have watched far less news in the last year as time has gone on. A relentless diet of negativity on any subject is wearing and disturbing.

Music radio channels are always there to suit all tastes. There are also a wide variety of excellent podcasts. I have really enjoyed listening to 'Hard Core History' by Dan Carlin (great for WW2 buffs) and the 'Irreverent' podcast – an alternative take on current affairs with a spiritual bent - by Rev Jamie Franklin and other erudite vicars. There are podcasts for every interest. Try some.

Most of us operate on 'automatic pilot' much of the time, So, we may need to learn how to be discerning about what is good and bad for us as individuals. If something makes us feel more fearful or anxious then we might need to limit that part of our 'diet'. But it may also include thinking those things through as logically as possible, maybe with the help of others, to get them into a new and more positive perspective.

It can be refreshing to seek out different sources of news and views. Reading books, papers and magazines is also good, as this apparently requires more 'slow brain' activity than watching TV or Netflix. This gives us time to deliberate, evaluate and reflect more. Reflection can also be a big help in 'rebooting' ourselves for a happier future.

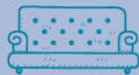
Avoid isolation: Meeting other people face-to-face is crucial. To help reduce past worries and future concerns focus on 'now'. When you can, don't just walk but absorb sights, sounds and smells. Listen to the birds. Watch bees. Take normal risks: The safety behaviours we have been encouraged to take can restrict the return to normal lifestyles. That is because we might think our survival depends upon still continuing those behaviours. There comes a time when we can conclude it is safe to resume past activities, without being reckless. Take gradual steps to regain enjoyable human contact.

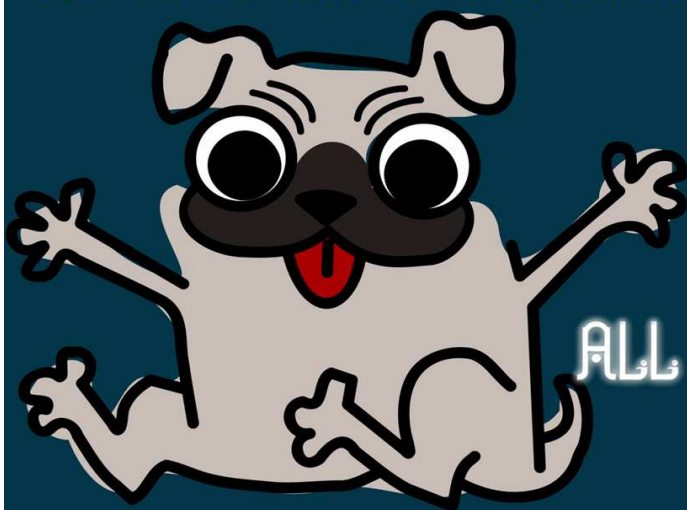

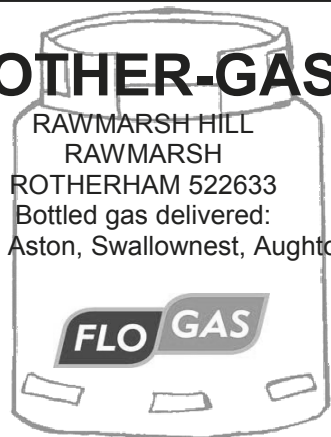

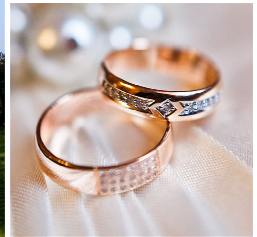
