

On Publishing my Book

The Rectory St James the Least of All

My dear Nephew Darren,



After all these years, who would have believed it: to have my own book printed! I must admit, I had imagined a leather-bound volume with gold leaf lettering on the spine – perhaps even titled 'Volume One', implying future delights when further work would appear. A paperback, held together with glue was a slight disappointment. The publisher's reason for a print run of 50, saying that it meant fewer would have to be dumped in cut-price bookshops, was not what I had expected either.

He seemed to think that my commentary on Eusebius's tables for cross-referencing the gospels, as explained in his letter to Carpianus, would not have mass interest. While I concede it will be unlikely to dent the sales of Harry Potter, and that I am unlikely to be involved in negotiating the film rights, I had hoped for slightly more enthusiasm for this stride forward in global knowledge.

The excitement of the book launch and signing was also tempered when only the bishop arrived, expecting a free copy, so he could mark it for theological errors. My suggestion that he take a copy to colour it in did not go down well. I suspect I will not now be asked to deliver a paper on it at the next clergy conference.

I was briefly excited when several parishioners came into the shop. But it turned out that one wanted to book a baptism with me, and another wanted to complain that at his recent wedding, I had nearly married the best man to the bride. I was tempted to tell him that the time may come when he wished that I had, but decided that would be another sale lost.

I could not even console myself with a free drink. The publisher had only brought two bottles of that particular white wine, of unknown origin, that seems specially reserved for book launches and retirement parties. I suspect it derives less from a vineyard and more from a laboratory. One bottle he kept for himself and the other disappeared after my Confirmation class came in to ask whether the book would be serialised on TV.

In the end, I bought all 50 copies myself, placed a note in the bookshop window saying that, due to exceptional demand, the print run had been entirely sold out. It has also solved the annual problem of Christmas presents; in your case, a second copy will probably arrive for your birthday too.



18th October - St Luke the Evangelist

St Luke, a Gentile, we owe the beautifully written Gospel of Luke, and the Book of Acts. He was a Greek physician, a disciple of St Paul, a companion on some of his missionary journeys, and an inspired writer.



Luke's gospel focuses on the compassion of Christ. His gospel contains some of the most moving parables, such as the Good Samaritan and Prodigal Son. This, with his emphasis on poverty, prayer and purity of heart, make up much of his appeal to the Gentles, for whom he wrote.

Women figure more prominently in Luke's gospel than any other: look out for the extended story of the Virgin Birth, and stories of Mary, Elizabeth, and the woman who was a sinner.

In Acts, Luke is remarkably good as linking sacred and profane history, as subsequent archaeology has shown. A principal theme of his Acts is how the early Christians moved away from Jerusalem into the pagan world, and especially on to Rome.

Luke is the patron saint of doctors, surgeons and artists (due to his picturesque style of writing). His symbol is an ox, sometimes explained by reference to the sacrifice in the Temple at the beginning of his Gospel. In England 28 ancient churches were dedicated to him.



24th October - Felix of Thibiuca



Do you value your Bible? If so, Felix of Thibiuca (247 - 303) is a good patron saint for you. The year was 303, and Diocletian was emperor in Rome. In February of that year he decided that Christians were NOT a good thing. So he issued an edict: all copies of the Christian Scriptures and all liturgical books were to be surrendered and burnt. Diocletian had decided to 'wind up' this upstart religion. The persecution began in Rome. By June of that year, the edict had reached North Africa, and Thibiuca, where Felix was bishop. Felix was arrested and interrogated. Yes, he said, he did have a copy of the Scriptures. No, he said, he would not hand them over.

Felix was a highly respected bishop, and even the authorities were loath to take immediate action against him. So they gave him three days grace to see sense, and back down. But Felix prayed and became only more certain that this was a conflict between the commandments of God and the commandments of men.

At the end of the three days Felix was referred to the proconsul. He still refused to hand over his Scriptures. His last words in public were memorable "God, I thank you. I have passed 56 years in this world. I have preserved my chastity; I have observed the Gospels; I have preached the faith and the truth. Lord God of heaven and earth, Jesus Christ, I bend my neck as a sacrifice for you, who abides for ever." He was condemned to be beheaded at Carthage, and became one of the first martyrs to die under Diocletian.

Needless to say, Diocletian did not succeed in destroying the Scriptures. Today there are hundreds of millions of copies around the world, and this month, Sunday, 23rd October, Christians will thank God for the Scriptures when they celebrate Bible Sunday



Gas

Do you remember Coal gas? It was nasty, smelly, dirty and dangerous but it was used to light and warm many homes, cook many dinners and drive many industries. Gas was manufactured from coal in Britain between 1792, when engineer William Murdock used coal gas to light his house and office, and 1981 when the last gasworks closed. Natural ('North Sea') gas has been instead since the 1970s.

In 1805 Twist Mill in Manchester became the first major enterprise to be gas lit, followed by Chapel Street, Salford and then everywhere... 'Town gas' was produced at 4,000 local gas works and myriad telescopic gasholders. Gasholders rose and fell depending upon the amount of gas in them to save space. You might remember Rotherhams? De-gassed coke was a useful domestic and industrial by-product, being almost pure carbon. The increasing cost of coal and the arrival of cheap oil spelled the end of coal gas along with its unattractive, infrastructure and pollution.

In the late 1990s I was asked to do some work for an elderly lady and her niece who lived in a large, Victorian, red brick, house. The older lady's father had been a successful local tradesman until his death in 1930. The ladies lived, snugly, 'below stairs' where a maid and a cook had once worked. A fire burned in the kitchen grate with the scent of soot, baking and washing in the air. There was an old radio burbling away and an electric light socket swinging from the ceiling, with an iron plugged into it. In the corner was a Creda cooker from Mexborough. That was the newest item. The other 'facilities' were 'basic.'

I was invited to 'please take a look above'. I climbed a tunnel-like, steep, flight of stairs with stipple painted brown walls. The 'tunnel' was carpeted with a, shades of brown, Tutankhamun style carpet, all the rage in the 1920's, held in place by brass stair rods. I emerged through a brown door at the top, into 1930. The house was a well-preserved, clean and tidy, mausoleum. I noticed peg rugs and a harmonium with lots of sheet music. It took pride of place. And... the domestic appliances. There were, elegant, Edwardian, matt black, gas mantles throughout, early twentieth century gas fires and an ancient water heater of some sort. Everything was in immaculate, museum, condition, all 'capped off' safely.

Nothing had been used upstairs for many, many years. Why so? 'Never converted over to natural gas. You know. One thing or another...never got round to it.' So, the ladies had simply moved downstairs sometime in the late 1960's to sit by the open fire. And they had stayed there. The inclination to change anything was quickly left behind upstairs. The situation was, it appeared, an unusual and rather unexpected consequence of introducing a new-fangled type of energy - The 'left behinds' of 1970. The older lady sadly passed away shortly afterwards. The younger is happily ensconced in a centrally heated, flat with a harmonium.







NEW FURNITURE AND FLOORING FOR ASTONCHURCH 1777

In the Aston Accounts of the Overseer of the Poor and the Churchwarden dated 1761-1785, the following two memorandums are written.



Plan showing the allotment of the several new seats stalls or pews in the Parish Church of Aston $- 24^{th}$ *March* 1781

Memorandum 1.

"On the inside of the Church door of Aston, during the month of May, 1777, a notice was fastened."

"The parishioners are requested to meet in the Vestry of this Church on Thursday next between the hours of eleven and twelve o'clock in the forenoon of the same day, to consider or dissent from, or agree to the wholly taking away and removing the seats, stalls, pews, forms and benches and also the pulpit, reading desk, Parish Clerk's pew, Font and floor or pavement of and within the body of this Church, and in the place and stead thereof to erect and build or cause to be erected and built new seats and pews in a more regular and uniform manner, with the Pulpit, reading desk, Parish Clerk's pew, and Font and to new pave or floor, the same agreeable to the plan herewith, or as near thereof so conveniently may be, at the expense of a Licence or faculty commission and continuation from the proper Ordinary and all other neighbours expenses attending the same to be born and defray a regular church assessment made upon the parishioners and inhabitants of the parish except the Rector for the time being who supports the church, and if agreed upon and consider or impower proper persons in their name apply to the Ordinary for a Licence or faculty for the purpose aforesaid. "And after such Licence or faculty is obtained and the intended new seats and pews and so built with a pulpit reading desk, Parish clerk's pew and Font and the Church new paved or floored agreeable to the plan aforesaid or as near the same as conveniently may be and the expenses attending the same and of the licence or faculty and all other expenses provisions and in consequence thereof are part discharged by a regular church assessment as aforesaid then such persons so empowered upon certifying the same to apply to such Ordinary for a commission to be directed to such persons as the Ordinary shall approve to allot and assign such new seats and pews to the parishioners and inhabitants of this parish according to their respective degrees Estates and

Conditions having regard to particular claims and to the number of their respective families."

"I do certify that the above notice or request was published in the Parish Church of Aston aforesaid on Sunday the 18th day of May 1777 in time of Divine service by one C. Alderson Curate."


Memorandum 2

Thursday the 22nd day of May one thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven of the hour of twelve o'clock in the forenoon of the same day at a Vestry meeting pursuant to a notice or request above copied/published in the parish church upon Sunday the eighteenth day of May in the time of divine service. We whose names are here unto subscribed being a majority of parishioners and inhabitants of Aston aforesaid paving church assessments so met having fully considered such notice or request do hereby agree to the wholly taking away and removing the seats, stalls, pews, forms and benches and also the pulpit, reading desk, parish clerk's pew, font and floor or pavement of and within the body of this church and in the place and stead thereof to the seating and building or causing to be erected and built new seats and pews in a more regular and uniform manner with a pulpit, reading desk, Parish Clerk's pew and font and in the new paving or flooring the same agreeable to the plan made for that purpose or as near thereto as conveniently may be at the expense of the parishioners and inhabitants of this Parish to whom such seats or pews may be allotted and we do hereby further agree that such expenses and the expenses for a Licence or faculty and confirmation from the proper Ordinary and all other necessary expenses attending the same shall be paid born and defrayed by money arising from the pews so intended to be erected and built in such manner as the persons approved by the Ordinary to allot value and assign new seats or pews to the parish and inhabitants of this parish shall think meet except the Rector for the time being who supports the change and except the expense of new paving or floor the said church which shall be born and defrayed by a regular Church assessment.

"And we do hereby empower the Revd. William Mason Clerk A.M. Rector of this parish John Scholey and George Gill the new elected Churchwardens of this parish or any two of them on behalf of the Parishioners and inhabitants of the said parish to apply to the proper Ordinary for a Licence or Faculty for the purposes aforesaid. And after such Licence or Faculty is obtained and the intended new seats or Pews so built with a Pulpit, Reading Desk, Parish Clerk's Pew and Font and the Church new paved and floored agreeable to the plan aforesaid or as near the same as conveniently may be, we do hereby request the said William Mason and John Scholey and George Gill or any two of them to carry the same to the said Ordinary and to apply to such Ordinary for a commission to be directed to such persons as these Ordinary shall approve to allot and assign such new seat or pews to the parishioners and inhabitants of this parish according to their respective degrees estates and conditions having regard to particular claims and to the number of their respective families, and to procure a confirmation of such allotments accordingly.




