

ROYAL MAIL WARNING

The Royal Mail will be adding barcodes to all regular stamps, enabling exciting new services by connecting physical stamps to the digital world through the Royal Mail app. But what will this mean for current stamps?

After 31st January 2023, **regular stamps without a barcode will no longer be valid**. You can either choose to use these stamps before this deadline (great for Christmas Cards), or swap them for the new barcoded ones through the Stamp Swap Out scheme.

If you try to use an old stamp, you may be subject to a surcharge.

Please note that Special Stamps with pictures on and Christmas Stamps without a barcode will continue to be valid and don't need to be swapped out.

HOW CAN YOU SWAP OLD STAMPS?

To swap out your old stamps go to https://www.royalmail.com/sending/barcodedstamps simply download one of the Stamp Swap Out forms and send them back to the Royal Mail with your non-barcoded stamps. If you have a printer, print the form and send back, along with your stamps, free of charge by writing on the envelope **Freepost SWAP OUT**. No other address details or postcode are needed.

There is also the option to swap more than £200 worth of stamps, but you will need post them to a separate address. Don't forget to download the .pdf and fill in all the correct details.

For those without a printer, you can request a **Stamp Swap Out form to be posted to you** by completing the Form online. The instructions for sending back will depend on the form you request.

The Royal Mail explain: "The move is part of the Company's extensive and ongoing modernisation drive and will allow the unique barcodes to facilitate operational efficiencies, enable the introduction of added security features and pave the way for innovative services for customers."



25th December - Why the World was ready for Christmas.

Ever wonder why Jesus was born when He was? The Bible tells us that "when the time had fully come, God sent forth His Son." The Jewish people had been waiting for their Messiah for centuries. Why did God send Him precisely when He did?

Many biblical scholars believe that the 'time had fully come' for Jesus because of the politics of the time. The Roman Empire's sheer size and dominance had achieved something unique in world history: the opportunity for travel from Bethlehem to Berwick on Tweed without ever crossing into 'enemy territory' or needing a 'passport'. For the first time ever, it was possible for 'common' people to travel wide and far, and quickly spread news and ideas. And all you needed were two languages – Greek to the east of Rome, and Latin to the west and north. You could set sail from Joppa (Tel Aviv) and head for any port on the Mediterranean and the Roman roads ran straight and true throughout the empire.

So the Roman Empire achieved something it never intended: it helped spread news of Christianity far and wide for 400 years. After that, the Empire crumbled, and the borders shut down. Not until the 19th century would people again roam so freely. The time for Jesus to be born, and for news of Him to be able to travel, had indeed 'fully come'.



A Christmas Carol

'Marley was dead: to begin with. There is no doubt whatever about that. The register of his burial was signed by the clergyman, the clerk, the undertaker, and the chief mourner. Scrooge signed it: and Scrooge's name was good upon 'Change, for anything he chose to put his hand to. Old Marley was as dead as a door-nail.' These are the opening words of Charles Dickens' (1812-1870) novella 'A Christmas Carol' (1843). As a boy I read my copy each evening starting on December 1st, before turning off my bedside light, finishing on Christmas Eve. I loved being transported to meet Ebenezer Scrooge the miser who hated Christmas and experiencing his inner transformation.

Of Scrooge Dickens says: 'The cold within him froze his old features, nipped his pointed nose, shrivelled his cheek, stiffened his gait; made his eyes red, his thin lips blue and spoke out shrewdly in his grating voice... He carried his own low temperature always about with him...' His equally cold, dead, business partner Jacob Marley visits on Christmas Eve, finding Scrooge eating gruel in 'his dressing-gown and slippers, and his nightcap', sitting before 'a very low fire indeed... [from] a handful of fuel.' Scrooge refuses to believe Marley who promises three further visitations, calling it 'Humbug'. Marley warns Scrooge that without visitations he will share his eternally restless doom. Marley is bound by a chain 'clasped about his middle. It was long, and wound about him like a tail; and it was made... of cash-boxes, keys, padlocks, ledgers, deeds, and heavy purses wrought in steel.' Scrooge had similarly made money his idol and could expect the same consequences.

The first visitation by The Ghost of Christmas Past reintroduces Scrooge to his past, of his abandonment at boarding school after the death of his mother, but also of his happy return home facilitated by his beloved sister Fan. Scrooge is apprenticed to jolly 'Old Fezziwig' and becomes engaged to Belle but his love of money overtakes him. Fan dies after giving birth to his nephew Fred, who Scrooge rejects, despite offering Scrooge his friendship. Belle marries another. Scrooge becomes regretful. The second spirit, The Ghost of Christmas Present shows Scrooge how terrible his disdain for the poor is and that without medical help his clerk Bob Cratchit's son 'Tiny Tim' will die.

The third Spirit, The Ghost of Christmas Yet to Come shows Scrooge that nobody will mourn his passing. Even his best shirt will be stolen from his body before burial. Scrooge is terrified by the prospect of facing the same judgment as Marley. He begs for another chance, awakening on Christmas morning, a changed man with a generous, warm heart. He visits his nephew, donates to charity and supports Cratchit's family. A Christmas Carol is a tale of Christmas and Easter rolled into one. It ends '…it was always said of [Scrooge], that he knew how to keep Christmas well, if any man alive possessed the knowledge. May that be truly said of us, and all of us! And so, as Tiny Tim observed, God Bless Us, Every One!'

During Reverend George Kirk's time at Aston from 1956 to 1980 he carried out very necessary restoration work in the church and he left records of this with the history group.

The Church was in a dilapidated condition but the work of restoration had already begun. The tower, its roof and battlements, replacement of decayed stones on the outside of the porch and the south side of the nave had been completed. An organ from St. Oswald's Millhouses had been installed the previous year.

In 1957 the south aisle roof was restored and apart from the main beams, all the timber had to be replaced. The Shields above the Fane Memorial were restored to their original colours by Mr. Smith, Principal of Rotherham School of Art.

In 1958 work was carried out in the South Aisle. The original intention was to restore the South Aisle as a Lady Chapel, but it was later agreed to furnish a Baptistry. The east end of the South Aisle was paved in stone and the font was moved from its position adjacent to the main door and placed at the east end. The font cover was designed by Mr. G G Pace, ARIBA On Sunday 19th January 1958, a service of dedication was held to the Glory of God and in memory of the men and women of Aston, Aughton and Swallownest who gave their lives in the Great Wars of 1914-1918 and 1939-1945. A casket containing a roll of honour was fixed to the wall under the east window.

Also in 1958 the oak screen cutting off the tower from the nave was moved in order to provide additional seating. This screen was part of the memorial for the 1914-1918 War but it was badly infested with wood worm and needed quick removal. An estimate of £750 was obtained for restoring the roof of the North Aisle but after dismantling it was found that all the timbers were so rotten and infested with woodworm and death watch beetle that the whole roof had to be replaced. It was a replica of the old and cost £1,500. A special appeal for £500 was launched and the Bishop of Sheffield contributed £300 from his own funds. Pointing and repairs were carried out to stonework on the south side of the nave above the South Aisle Roof. The church yard was put into a tidy condition and several grave stones were removed and used to provide a path from gate to porch.

In 1959 the interior of the porch had been previously plastered and fitted with a ceiling (probably in the restoration carried out in 1890). This was removed and several faulty stones replaced. The roof of the nave and chancel were painted and on the advice of the architect, Mr. G G.Pace, the nave was painted sage green and the chancel white.

In 1960 the new altar and sanctuary were dedicated. The standard candlesticks, in wrought iron, were presented by Mr. Walsh in memory of his mother, a daughter of Rev. Haynes, Rector of this parish from 1872 to 1909. These candlesticks together with wrought iron altar ornaments were designed by Mr. Pace and the figure on the crucifix was designed by Michael Murray. The altar candlesticks were bought by the Aston British Legion Women's Branch. A new frontal for the altar in green Lyndley Lurex cloth, a carpet and a wrought iron stand for flowers were bought. The Church central heating system was converted to oil burning.

In 1961 the stonework of two windows on the south side of the chancel was restored in Clipsam stone and the ornate style of the earlier windows was simplified. They were designed by Mr. G. G. Pace and executed by Mr. John Hanstock, stonemason of Aston. The glass of the window nearest to the nave was of coloured geometric pattern, a memorial to Harriet Alderson 1895. This was replaced by clear leaded glass. The east wall of the chancel was re-pointed.

The floor at the east end of the North Aisle was paved in stone using voluntary labour and was then furnished as a Lady Chapel, all the furnishings being provided by private gifts. The Altar was made by H. Robinson and Cooke to a design by Mr. Pace and the timber was bought by the Young Wives' Group. The Credence Table was designed and made by John Hanstock, the stone bought by the Servers' Guild. The red and gold Hanoverian frontal was given by All Saints' Guild. Brass candlesticks were given by Mr. George White of Aston in memory of his wife and a stone coloured carpet was given by Mr and Mrs J Renshaw of Killamarsh.

In 1962 the floor around the pulpit was paved in stone. The pulpit itself was moved from its position abutting the north side of the chancel arch to the front of the respond of the east arch in the north aisle. In 1963 a new west window was installed in memory of Adrian Hanna, for several years a choirboy. The east wall of the Chancel was re-pointed. In 1964 a white chasuble set with green contrasting material was made by Mrs. Botfield and used for the first time on Christmas Day. And finally, in 1965 the church central heating boiler was renewed.



I heard the bells on Christmas day Their old familiar carols play, And wild and sweet the words repeat Of peace on earth, good will to men.


I thought how, as the day had come, The belfries of all Christendom Had rolled along th'unbroken song Of peace on earth, good will to men.


